Hi my name is Jodi Frade and I'd like to welcome you to Challenged Family Resource Center. Our agency is like no other you will be involved with. All our early intervention staff are parents who have a child or children with special needs and can easily identify with the range of emotions and difficulties we can sometimes face in our special world. We work closely with Merced County Office of Education and other agencies that can be of benefit to the families we serve, while still maintaining our parent friendly approach, as we have all needed support and guidance at some point in our extraordinary walk in life.

In the beginning, Challenged started off as a support group facilitated by a very special mom named Lyalla Dias. Lyalla started the group after the birth of her daughter, born with cerebral palsy and sought out other support groups for parents who had children with special needs, but found nothing so, she decided to start her own and man, am I glad she did. I remember going to my first support group twenty four years ago with so much anxiety and uncertainty about the way I was feeling since no one else I had talked to prior, could seem to understand. Their natural response was to either change the subject or try to fix it .Once I got to the meeting with my parent peers I was able to really be heard and more importantly validated. I cried and was able to voice exactly how I felt.

The mask of being on top of EVERYTHING was taken off, where I could show how vulnerable and scared I was. They didn't change the subject nor did they try to fix it because they understood what I was going through as a brand new mom who was now in their circle of love and support. I'm so grateful to those parents who encouraged me along the way and who helped me adapt to my new life. I left group that summer night in my 1982 Monte Carlo with the windows down , music on full blast and a new sense of empowerment.

Today I am the Director of Challenged and have the hope that each and every parent will be able to receive the gift I was given through parent to parent support. Although, Challenged has changed somewhat over the years, we have a free of cost Parent Education Center that has been completely supported through Merced County Office of Education/SELPA funding and where anyone who has a child with special needs is welcomed to use our computers, check out books or special toys, and talk to a parent face to face and heart to heart. We are here and understand that sometimes we, as parents, just need to be giving support, plain and simple. We are not here to change the subject or try and fix what you're going through, but we'd love to see you leave with YOUR windows down, music blasting and a new sense of empowerment.

BIG IDEA #2: DON'T ACCIDENTALLY REWARD UNWANTED BEHAVIOR


It is important to remember that every time we give in to unwanted or bad behavior it makes it more likely that children will do that behavior again in the future. So, if a child is crying for candy and we give it to him, he will probably cry again when he wants candy.



Thanks to funding from First 5 Merced County and the Merced County Mental Health Dept., the **Caring Kids** program provides resources and services to children ages 0 to 5 and their families to help support healthy and optimal child development. The program helps children learn self-regulation and social skills. It teaches parents and caregivers the best ways to help children develop socially and emotionally. These services help build protective factors and reduce challenging behaviors which will increase the chances of children being successful in school.

The Merced County Office of Education Head Start Program serves children and their families and provides comprehensive services in the areas of health, nutrition, mental health services, family support services and disability services. PEI iMatter

PEI iMatter is a school-based social skills program for school aged children that teaches social emotional skills aimed at reducing impulsive and aggressive behaviors, while increasing social competence aimed at skill development. We will teach children to identify and understand their own emotions as well as others' around them. They will also learn to reduce impulsiveness, choose positive goals, manage their emotional reactions and decision making process when emotionally stimulated.

2 Key Elements to Healthy Parenting: Communication:

- The exchange of thoughts, message, and information by speech, visuals, signals, writing, and behaviors
- Good communication helps children and parents to develop confidence, feelings of self-worth, and good relationships with others.


Respect:

- The best way to get respect from your child is to treat him or her respectfully
- Give your child the same courtesies you would give others or you would want others to give you *Speak politely
 - *Listen to the child's opinion
 - *Pay attention when child speaks to you
 - *Be kind
- By doing this you are modeling behaviors that your child will follow

Homemade Bubbles



About

Remember how much fun you had with bubbles? Well, your child will love them just as much as you did! From blowing to popping and chasing, bubbles offer a great way to get some physical activity - and bragging rights to whoever blows the biggest one!

How To

What You'll Need:

- 12 cups water
- 1 cup dish soap
- 1 cup cornstarch
- 2 tbsp baking powder
- Bubble wands, wire coat hangers, paper towel tube, plastic rings

Mix ingredients together in order in a clean pail. Stir occasionally in a gentle pattern so there isn't too much foam. Take away any foam as it forms. Add another cup of water when the pail is half empty.

If you don't have any bubble wands, use a paper towel tube and plastic rings, or bend a coat hanger into a loop. Store extra solution in a tightly sealed container. Solution that has been sitting for a few days makes the biggest bubbles!
